DESIGN IMPLICATIONS

1. HOME-LIKE ENVIRONMENT

This dementia village emphasizes the unique care utilized in this environment, with a small, homelike scale and few amenities within the residence.

- Small, human scale that represents a home environment
- A large, open area connecting the living room, kitchen, and dining room brings a sense of home.
- Maintaining private bedrooms with the personalization of home decor.
- Allowing space for personal items/ decor can help the space feel more at home, for example, built-ins/ casework.

2. WAYFINDING

This dementia care facility highlights the use of separate wings with individual characteristics for each wing for residents to identify their living quarters.

- Designs should have a distinct appearance and an overall layout with unique and varied landmarks.
- Recognizable objects and artworks are the best design choices for wayfinding. Color is another good indication.
- Exterior views are also a wayfinding method as well.
- Personal decor from home outside of the rooms to recognize their room.
- The layout is open and continuous, which allows for wandering and meaningful and purposeful expression.

3. OUTDOOR SPACES

This dementia village has beautiful landscapes for residents to enjoy in their downtime. It promotes well-being and encourages walking with an emphasis on physical health.

- Healing gardens create a therapeutic activity that relieves stress and promotes well-being and physical therapy.
- Creating seating areas to promote community and socialization.
- Smaller potting areas to create an additional outdoor activity.
- Using landscape to create boundaries but providing space for people to move.

4. SAFETY & SECURITY

Residents are free to wander on this enclosed campus with beautiful landscapes. Staff is available at all times, but they are often dressed as they would be in everyday spaces instead of in a healthcare environment.

- People feel safe due to elements of the built environment
- Technology throughout the building to assist residents with tasks
- The layout encourages wandering but in a safe, habitual environment
- Safety call buttons in the rooms to alert caregivers if there is an emergency.
- Motion sensors are incorporated throughout the building to ensure the resident's safety if a fall occurs.

5. COMMUNITY

This assisted living facility hosts an array of amenities on-site for residents to enjoy to promote community, such as this large dining area; others include a hair salon, restaurant, etc.

- Having areas for people to connect allows for social interaction and engagement, which results in improved well-being.
- Providing other areas besides the private quarters for residents to entertain guests/visitors
- It relieves stress and helps with the feeling of people feeling cooped up.










BUBBLE FLOW/ CIRCULATION




